2021 Koestler Awards

As a Koestler Associate we hope you'll be excited to enter our Awards again in 2021, and to encourage others to do so. Enclosed with this letter are the resources you will need. Thank you so much for helping us spread the word about our work, we really appreciate your continued support, and can't wait to start receiving your entries in the new year!

Entrants can send visual artwork, writing and music to us from January until the deadline on 22nd April 2021. It is important that every entry is sent with a corresponding entry form, and that every entry form has been signed by a member of prison or probation staff.

The enclosed resources include:

- **Guidance notes** explaining the terms and conditions of entering the Awards: what you can enter, how to enter, our artform categories, and the awards cycle timeline.
- **Entry forms**. Each entrant can enter up to 5 pieces of work, in any of our artform categories. If you don't want to enter 5 pieces, you can always pass some of these forms on to someone else to use.
- **Posters.** We would be really grateful if you could help us to promote this year's Awards by displaying these on your wing, in your education department, or at your probation office, and telling someone who doesn't know about Koestler how to get involved.

These materials are also being sent to education departments in establishments, so you can direct others who are interested in entering to get entry forms from there, or to write to us to be sent them directly.

In case you missed it... for 2021 our themed category is 'Together'. We're looking forward to seeing lots of different interpretations in the work it inspires!

Art Aid

In response to the coronavirus lockdown, we have been sharing Art Aid activity sheets with simple creative tasks that can be done in cell. We know how important creativity is to our entrants so we wanted to provide some inspiration in a very difficult time. Each sheet includes a task devised by a current or former Koestler mentee, and some information about their own story and experience with Koestler Arts.

A new sheet is added to our website on the first Monday of every month, and we include the most recent sheet with each Associates newsletter - we hope you'll enjoy the December task enclosed. 




Look At Me

On other days, prison sounds like nothing at all, Like the emptiness of distant space. It sounds like the surprising silence Of a dropped clock, that's forgotten how to tick. Or it whispers like playing hide and seek as a kid, Your own breath loud in your ears. Still. Waiting. And a nagging fear that everyone else went home,

And perhaps you'll never, ever, be found.

No Lockdown in the Imagination

Our annual showcase of work entered into the Koestler Awards is on display at the Southbank Centre, London, until 13th December. 'No Lockdown in the Imagination' is an outdoor display of around 60 works across the site's windows. Most works are represented by large scale high definition photographs, enabling us to showcase the intricate details of smaller pieces, with many of these images visible from across the River Thames. A number of music and spoken word pieces play on speakers around the site.

2021 Exhibitions

We are thrilled to have an exciting programme of exhibitions planned for 2021, showcasing more fantastic entries to the 2020 Koestler Awards around the UK. Whilst these plans are subject to change according to future government restrictions, we are hopeful many visitors around the country will get the opportunity to see and appreciate our entrants' talent and creativity.

January - May: Millennium Gallery, Sheffield

'My Path' will be Koestler Arts' first ever Yorkshire exhibition. It has been curated by a group of young people under supervision with Sheffield Youth Justice Service, who have selected works relating to themes of the self and the planet - the small and the vast.

A small selection of the exhibited works will then be displayed in Ripon Prison and Police Museum, North Yorkshire across the summer months.

January - June: The National Justice Museum, Nottingham A selection of Koestler Awards entries will be displayed alongside pieces from the Museum's own collection, in exploration of the theme of 'power' and the question: 'Where does the power come from in a work of art?'

HOME, Manchester

Plans are underway for an exhibition of artwork by Koestler entrants across the North West of England as part of the 'Ripples of Hope' festival of human rights at HOME in Manchester.
