

# Koestler Associates Update - Winter 2017

## Inside, curated by Antony Gormley

Thank you to everyone who helped make *Inside* our most-attended show ever! Over 30,000 people visited, and it was featured by Jon Snow on the C4 News. We also ran a London Underground poster campaign for the first time. Antony selected around 160 pieces for the show, which included audio, film and written pieces among the 2D and 3D works. All the works were selected to respond to his exhibition theme, 'Inside,' and the show aimed to give a feel for what life is currently like in UK prisons.

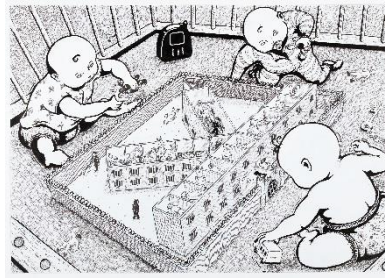
In 2018 we plan to work with families of prisoners – watch this space! (There is no exhibition theme to bear in mind this year).

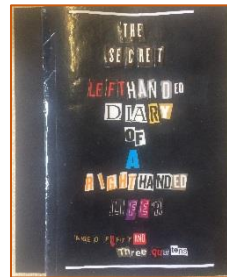

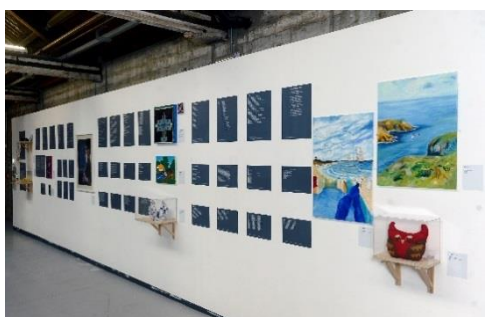

## *Narrative*, The Koestler Scotland Exhibition curated by Jenni Fagan

We returned to Tramway last year for the Koestler Scotland exhibition, which was curated by the acclaimed author and poet, Jenni Fagan. The exhibition received an estimated 1400 visitors during its 6-week run and featured around 180 works, including visual works, writing and music. We held a number of events as part of the exhibition programme – a Family Day, Voices from Prison in collaboration with Vox Luminis, a Mindfulness Tour delivered by Martin Stepek and we invited the Garthamlock Community Group, through Citizens Theatre, to perform a short piece at the opening of the exhibition. We also collaborated with STIR magazine who produced a wonderful little anthology called, '*Language from the Heart*.' This featured poems and artworks from Scotland and was available within the exhibition space for people to take home with them.

Last year we launched, Koestler Voices vol. 1, an anthology that presents some of the best poetry from the 2016 and 2017 Koestler Awards, with a foreword by poet Benjamin Zephaniah. We also gave a free copy to every prison library in the UK. The anthology has been very successful with over 500 sold so far.

The 2018 Koestler Awards are now open for entry. This year's themed category is 'Connections'. Have a go at producing a poem, drawing, painting, song or any other Koestler artform using the word 'Connections' as a theme. (You can of course enter the other categories using any theme.)

Theatre is a focus this year, as we have partnered with Synergy Theatre Project to ensure all Stage Play entries will be read and judged by a team of theatre professionals and ex-prisoners. The Koestler Awards submission deadline is Friday 13 April 2018, and winners will be announced at the end of August. Entry forms and guidance notes are included.
