Entries are judged by over 100 experts from different fields. Over the years, judges have included Turner Prize-winning artist Jeremy Deller, Poet Laureate Carol Ann Duffy, representatives from the Victoria & Albert Museum, the British Council, the National Theatre, the British Film Institute, Louise Galvin, Speech Debelle, Louis Theroux, and Hot Chip.

Animation

Paul Bush

Paul Bush is a filmmaker most well-known for experimental stop frame animation. He has made numerous short and medium length films that have been shown around the world. He has directed commercials and written four feature length screenplays one of which he directed and was released in UK cinemas to critical acclaim in 2013.

John Eaton

John Eaton is an animation director and illustrator. Several of his films have been used as promotional music videos for Bands/ music artists including The Coral and Bill Ryder Jones. His films have been in over 30 film festivals and his belated graduation film is due out imminently to be submitted to short film festivals.

Schneider's punk-baroque ceramic sculptures explore the boundaries of functionality and aesthetic standards. Having grown up in East Berlin, Schneider is interested in the tension between rebellion and tradition. Daring to cry out for personal expression - and subsequent punishment - has shaped her personality and artwork.

Joanna Szwej-Hawkin

Joanna grew up and studied in Poland. She now lives in Nunhead, London. Her contemporary pottery and ceramics, both functional and decorative, combine traditional and modern aesthetics. Joanna likes to give her mainly slab-built earthenware and stoneware pots, a slightly distressed look. Her unique trademark, is inlaying the bases of her pots with slips and underglazes. She makes limited editions and one-off pieces.
