This task is set by Koestler Award winner, exhibited artist and current mentee, Sean.

My Story

Having served a number of prison sentences, I have been able to learn the rudiments of drawing, painting and even some sculpture techniques. Before exploring visual arts in my early thirties (I am now in my mid-fifties) my main artistic expression was poetry.

As I became more proficient; visual and non-visual art became a safe way of looking at issues I felt necessary to confront. These could be personal feelings, thoughts, happenings in society, or just how I saw the world. Since 2010 I have been entering the Koestler Awards and have been fortunate to have won some awards and even more so to have been part of some amazing Koestler exhibitions. The effect has been to encourage my artistic endeavours and to have my voice heard, even when incarcerated.

I have found that one of the most difficult parts of the artistic process is formulating an idea. Here are a couple of activities that can spark an idea, or mould an initial idea into greater clarity.

Brainburst


The first is a 'Brainburst', which is also sometimes referred to as a 'Spidergram'.

It begins with a word, phrase or sentence, that the artist intends to explore. In the example overleaf the catalyst is the word 'tears', which then connects with related thoughts or feelings. Don't discount anything that comes to mind, you never know which word will be the spark that begins a creative journey.

A similar 'brainburst' helped to create the poem 'Rain', which later became a sculpture which I entered into the 2020 Koestler Awards. The first verse was:

Electric chair stifles rain.
Big boy, so get lost rain.
Laugh at the devil rain.
Passenger, ignorant of rain.

Taking a Pencil for a Walk

The second exercise is what I refer to as 'taking a pencil for a walk' though a pen can also suffice. It involves using a drawing implement to build up a doodle by way of expanding shapes and creating forms, either figurative or abstract, through shading and line drawing.

It could be a follow on exercise from the first, as words or lines of verse have been a starting point for many of my previous art pieces, I connect images naturally with script. However, the 'walking pencil' can also be a starting point. Personally I like to listen to music that reflects my mood whilst 'walking my pencil'. In this example I was listening to some 'old skool' house music, which has an influence in the evolving organic figure. This doodle then became a maquette/sculpture, which I hope to one day make into a larger work.



Art helped me through many years of incarceration and in these difficult times it may just bring you some solace. The Koestler Awards can give focus for any artistic endeavour, there are 52 categories, I still enter even though I am now on licence and in society.
