Koestler Arts produce monthly Art Aid sheets featuring creative tasks that can be done in cell and with just paper and a pencil. New Art Aid sheets are available from the first Monday of every month. This sheet has been made with support from The Arts Society Northleach.

JANUARY 2024

For each Art Aid sheet, we commission an artist or writer who has engaged with Koestler Arts to set a creative task and share their experience with creativity. This month we asked Koestler Award winner, exhibited painter, and former mentee, Seb, who is a skilled writer and artist.

My Story

When I got bored at school I would doodle - draw little shapes and pictures around the words on the covers of my exercise books. It often got me into trouble because I should have been concentrating I suppose, but it was something that gave me a lot of pleasure. Then in secondary school we did a lesson on 'illuminated letters and manuscripts', which sounded very fancy but was just about writing something and then drawing different shapes and swirls around some of the letters - exactly like my doodling!

Although I hadn't been the best student in school, art had always interested me, and when I was inside later in life I suddenly had plenty of time to fill. Entering the Koestler Awards gave me the confidence to try something new - I got feedback on my art and writing saying 'Keep up the good work' and 'You're a natural', which made me feel like I might be able to handle a degree. I started an Open University degree on Art History, and you can imagine how pleased I was when I found out one of the modules was about illuminated script - doodling was back!

Once I was released, I was fortunate enough to be placed with a Koestler mentor, who not only worked with me on ideas for getting my work exhibited, published and performed, but also offered me a lot of support as I completed my degree. I now have books for sale on Amazon and Kindle, and art displayed in galleries and historic buildings. Although I have completed my time with my Koestler mentor, I still receive support and encouragement from the team and enjoy participating and visiting Koestler exhibitions all over the country. And yes, I'm still doodling in my free time, although I have a lot less of that these days!



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My Task: Illuminate Your Writing

During my studies, I learned that for centuries people have been writing stories and religious texts and decorating their words with intricate designs and beautiful artwork, known as illuminated manuscripts. The earliest known

example is by the Roman poet Virgil and dates to 4th Century BCE. The invention of the printing press stopped a lot of the production of illuminated manuscripts, but they are now highly prized by collectors and lovers of art and books.

My task invites you to use the illuminated lettering technique on a piece of your writing to make it stand out - try it on a poem, letter, or short story. Once you've done one, you'll want to do more!

On a piece of scrap paper, write out a rough draft of your words - your letter or poem for example. This version can be messy as you work out exactly what you want to write.

Then, on a good sheet of plain paper, use a ruler (or another straight object like a card) and pencil to lightly draw lines across the page, about 1cm apart, to make your paper lined. These lines will help keep your writing straight and neat.

Near the top left corner (or top right if you're using a script that reads right to left), draw a rectangle 6cm tall and 4cm wide. Erase the horizontal lines within this box so it's blank inside. Write the first letter of your piece of writing inside this box, large enough to fill it.

Decorate this first letter, adding illustrations and patterns around it, within the box. Try tying in the decoration with your piece of writing - if it's the first letter of someone's name, draw things that remind you of them, or if your poem is about nature, draw plants and flowers. Get really creative here, just remember to make sure the letter is still visible. You might want to add colour if you have coloured pencils or pens.

Write the rest of your piece of writing on the lines you drew, as neatly as you can. Remember you've already written the first letter, so miss it off the first word of your piece. In my poem below, I've missed off the 'I' in 'Its' because the 'I' is my illuminated letter in the box. Don't worry about the next few lines being next to the illuminated letter, write them with all their letters as you usually would. When it's done, you can keep it, send it to that special





someone or enter it into the 2024 Koestler Awards as a piece of poetry or calligraphy. Have fun!
